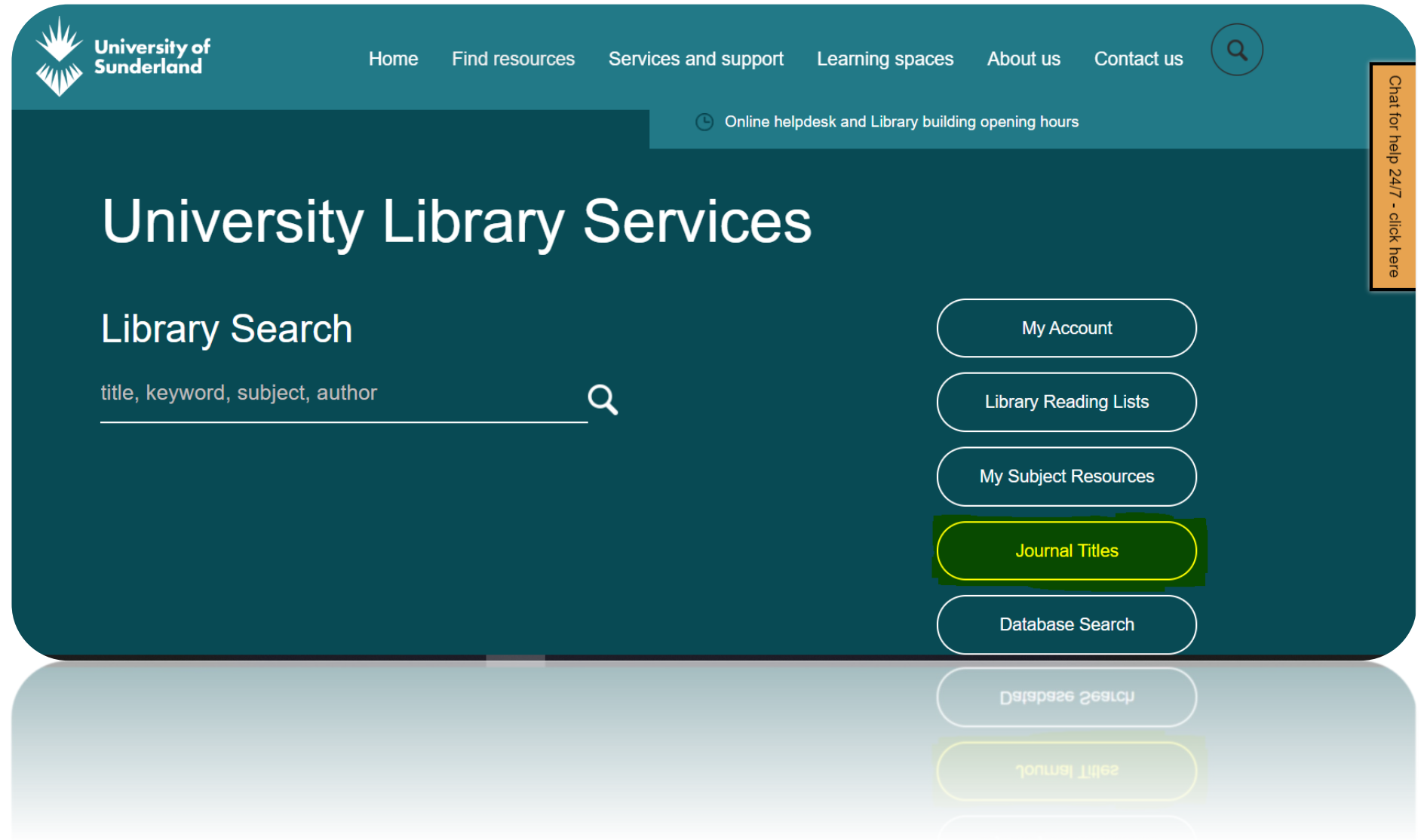
Bibliographic Info search

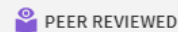

Why can't I log into a database (for example Science Direct)?

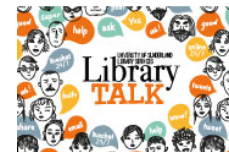
If you're logging into any external database you will need to choose one of the following:
